Standing Committee Information

What is a committee?

A committee is a group of people, typically consisting of members of a larger group (the BG Student Body), who work together to accomplish a specific task or goal. A standing committee is a type of committee that has continuing tasks throughout the year. There are currently 3 Standing Student Council Committees: Blood Drive Committee, Celebration Committee, and Sideline Cancer Committee. (ANY student at Bishop Guilfoyle can be a student council committee member and can join a committee at any time of the year.

Committee Leadership: What are Committee Chairs?

Each standing committee is led by 4 Student Council Members: 1 Senior Chair, 1 Junior Chair, 1 Sophomore Chair, and 1 Freshman Chair. Committee Chairs are elected positions. The Chairs of each committee will be responsible for accomplishing assigned committee tasks. Chairs will lead their committee members in order to accomplish their work.

Committee Meeting Schedule: 2 Afterschool Meetings a Month in addition to scheduled committee specific events.

- Once a month Committee Chairs will meet with members of their committee to plan and accomplish committee work.
- Once a month Student Body Officers and Committee Chairs will meet after school for a Student Council Officer Meeting. At these meetings, Committee Chairs will report on the progress the committee has made during the past month and report on upcoming events.

- The ability to delegate responsibility, share authority, and follow up without intimidation.
- Organizational skills or a great planning and scheduling program.
- Enthusiasm and dedication.

- Recruiting donors, organizing workers, and soliciting food donations.
- On the day of drives, Chairs work check-in table.
- These leaders will work closely with school administration and our local American Red Cross.
